



Equipment Control

in USA Boxing competitions



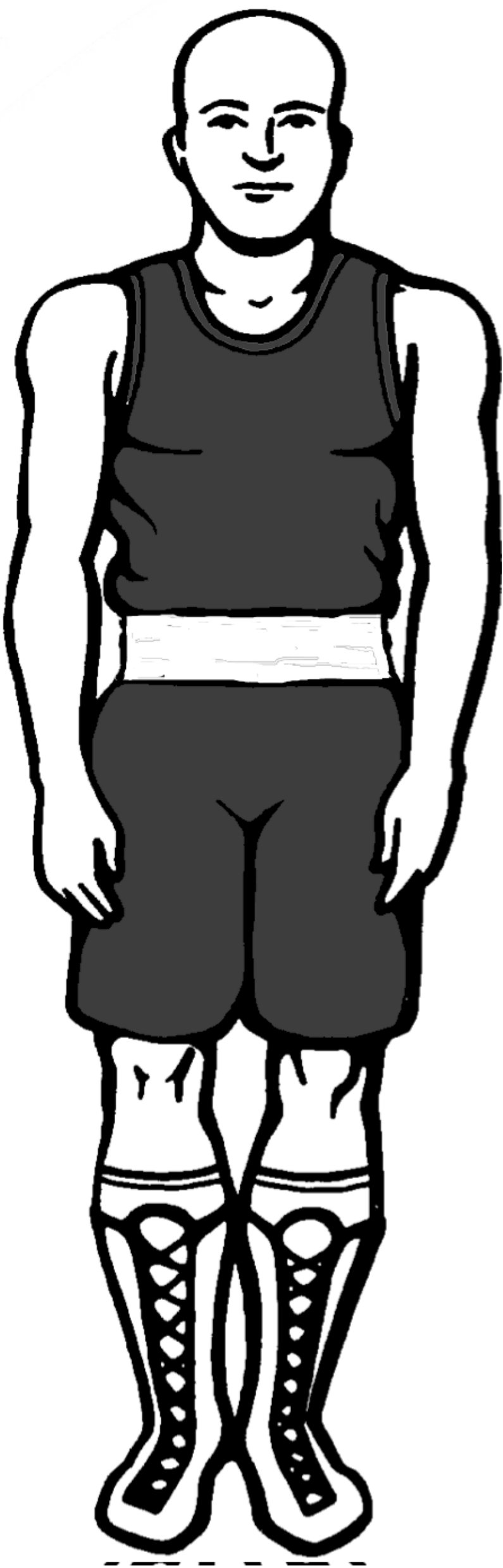
Free of metal (no pins or barrettes).
No earrings.

Boxers with long hair must use a
hair cap underneath headguard.

Clean-shaven. No beard.

Form-fitted mouthguard.
No red, no pink.

Thin layer of Vaseline may
be used on the face only.



- Sleeveless shirt.
- Waistband different color from shirt.
- Groin protector mandatory for males.
- No binding (such as tape) on the uniform.
- Shorts may not extend past the knee.
- Tights or compression garments may not be visible.
- Soft-soled shoes.
- Shoelaces tied securely.

Authorized Bandages

Handwrap: stretchy cotton material with Velcro closure — 2” x 98”—177” (5cm x 2.5m—4.5m)

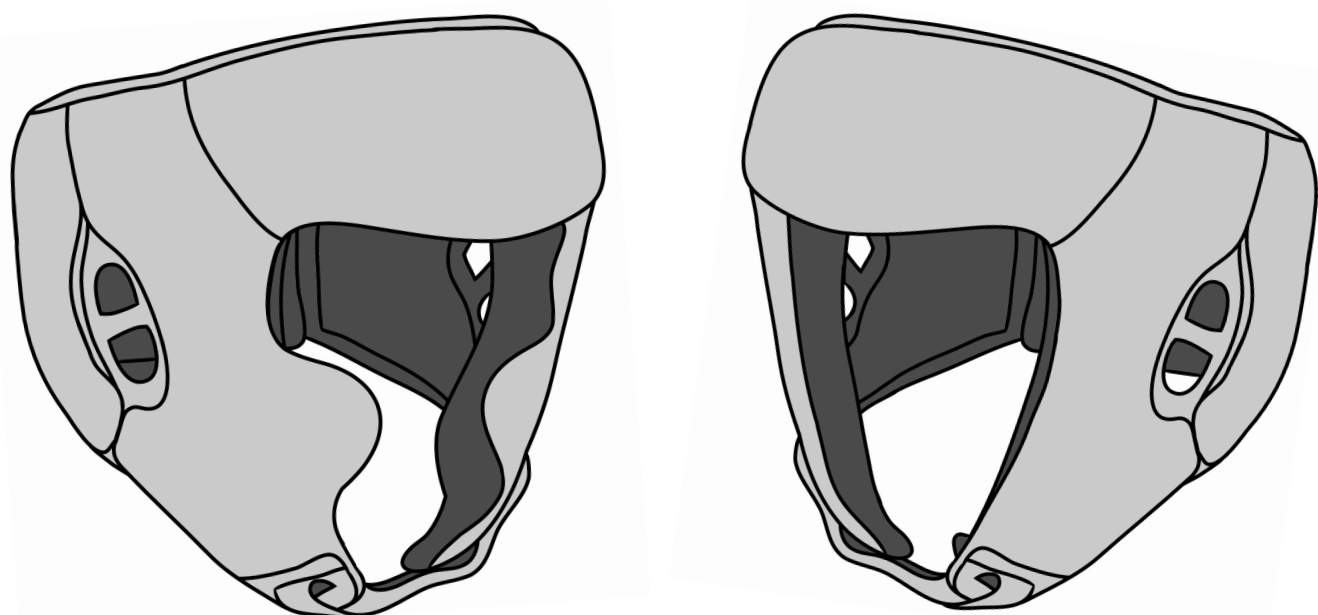
Gauze/Tape: 2” x 49’ + gauze pad of 4”x16’ for knuckles (5cm x 15m + gauze pad of 10cm x 5m)
(Maximums) Tape = 1” x 16’ (2.5cm x 5m)



1/4” tape okay between fingers.
No tape across the knuckles.

Officials may inspect bandages before & after bout:

- ✓ Visual — material within maximum allowance
— no tape across the knuckles
- ✓ Physical — no foreign substances
— nothing solid to the touch

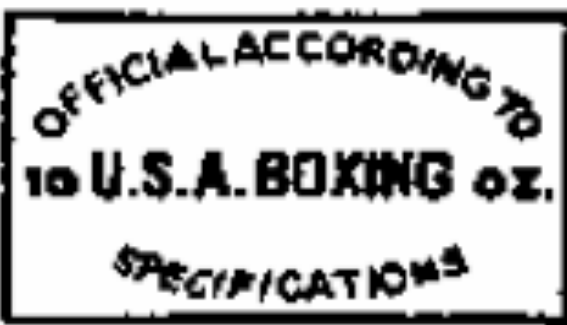


Headgear may have
cheek protectors or be open face.
Headgear must be fitted correctly.
Wearing the same color as the corner color
is strongly advised.

Authorized Glove Weights for Club Shows

Below 152lbs	10oz, 12oz, or 16oz
152lbs and above	12oz or 16oz
Master’s Division	16oz
Developmental Bouts	12oz or 16oz

Both boxers must wear same weight gloves in the match.
16oz gloves are not used in advancing tournaments.



Headgear must have visible “USAB- or AIBA-approved” label.
Boxers may only use gloves provided by Equipment Control (Glove Table).
